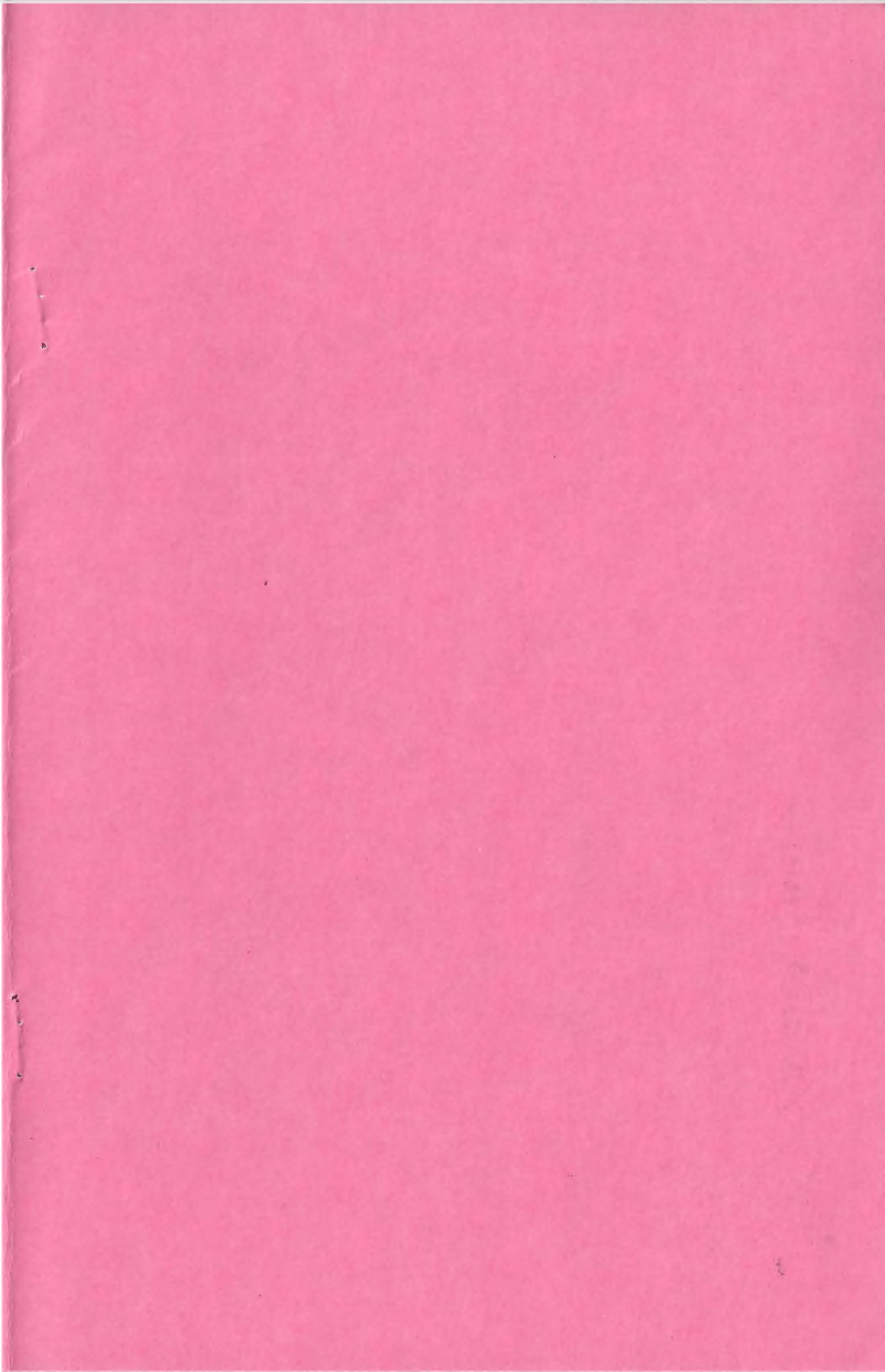


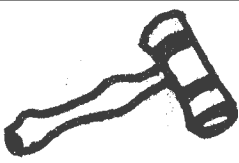

The practice lure, which will be held after the match, will be \$1.00 per dog. Greg is planning to ask Agnes Tara to be our Hospitality Chairman. John Hays volunteered to be Chief Ring Steward and Greg will assist. Ken Gabriel will set up the rings. Carol will purchase the judges gift and she and Ken will make first place trophies for each class. Mary Major is donating trophies for Best Puppy and Adult, and Best Opposite Sex Puppy and Adult.

Mr. Frey, the AKC representative, was present for the entire match and offered some fine suggestions in improving our matches. I think he will forward to the AKC a favorable report on our match.

If there is any criticism on my part concerning the match it is about entries. The premium list had been sent out far enough in advance for all exhibitors to pre-enter. We must put on two more B matches before progressing to the A match stage. While we had eleven day of the match entries, I would like to see everyone pre-enter. 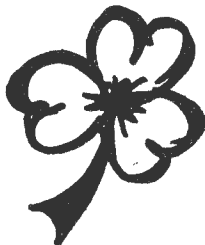
Russ Greene requested that we have Obedience at our upcoming match since there are members who are very interested in working their dogs in Obedience.

COMMENTS

Matches (G. Shaw), hunts (T. Souza) and lures (R. Heskett) have all been more than self-sustaining - i.e. have turned a profit. So have necklace (P. Turnage), Calendar (C. Gabriel), and pin/decal (B. Hays) sales.

Fixed expenses included insurance (including special endorsement for Golden Gate Park match), \$159; Marin County Humane Society (for use of facilities for meetings), \$60; ASFA (annual

dues and delegate allowance), \$30; Campaign Trail (club listing), \$12. Treasurer's postage was \$14.40.

The remaining principal club expenditures relate to the Hound's Bugle, the Yearbook, and general administration (printing and mailing) etc.). All three of these functions are performed by our capable and over-worked Secretary. The Bugle returns modest revenues (advertising and subscriptions) but is primarily a charge against general funds. The Yearbook this year has been priced with the hope that it can at least break even, so that reserves can be built up against the time when the club's matches and shows will be AKC sponsored with the attendant increase in cost.

As of 7/18/78, 50 memberships were paid up, including 10 added since last year. 25 were still in arrears but presumably will respond in due course.

NCIWC has had a good year fincally and at present is in a healthy financial condition.

NCIWC BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 8, 1978

The meeting was called to order at 8:05 pm in the Marin County Humane Society by President Mary Major. Board members present along with Mary included John Hays, Richard Heskett, Paula Turnage, Carol Gabriel, Russ Greene, and Melody Waters. Absent were Greg Shaw and Ruth Knipstein.

Minutes of the previous two meetings were read and approved.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$700+ and over a dozen new members. Dues in arrears are being collected. John suggested that yearbooks be sold for \$5 to members and \$10 to non-members. The Board moved and passed to do so.

Bugle report. HELP! New committee: Carol Gabriel, conformation results; Melody Waters, lure coursing news; Betty Moore, obedience statistics. John Hays will provide Xeroxed address labels to assist the mailing process.

Constitution. Changes suggested by the committee and Board will be printed in the Bugle. The next club meeting will be designated a special membership for voting on the suggested changes.

Yearbook. They are available from either Carol Gabriel or Paula Turnage.

Lure Coursing. New chairman Marty Mulac is arranging for a practice session on October 7th. We should have our refurbished lure machine ready by then (courtesy of Ken Gabriel). Marty will notify everyone as soon as a definite location is found. It was moved and passed to have Marty purchase a new continuous loop machine and any additional needed equipment, not to exceed \$300.

Program. Mary will check with Jessica Winship to see if we can borrow her lure coursing movies.

New Business. Stan and Jane Wandruff spoke briefly about problems with puppy paralysis which quite a few IW breeders have experienced. They had been working with a veterinarian at UC Davis on the problem. Dr. Blythe is now at the U. of Oregon and would like to continue her research. She is asking the dog fancy to support this project, as she is not presently being funded. Stan and Jane will try to get a report from her on her work to date, and various club members volunteered to take the appeal to their all-breed clubs.

The secretary was instructed to order stationary and applications to be printed.

Sharon Yaskulski will be checking out several possible meeting sites and will report back to the club. The object is to try to vary our meeting locations to make it easier for more members to attend.

New Members. Robin A. Davis was voted into the club. WELCOME!!!!

The meeting was adjourned at 9:20 pm.

A report on the Corona Virus, given by Dr. Sharon Yaskulski, followed the business meeting. Excerpts from the report follow.

REMEMBER—The November 10th Meeting is a SPECIAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING to vote on Constitutional changes. See you there!

REPORT ON THE CORONA VIRUS

Club member Sharon Yaskulski, a veterinarian, was pressed into service at the September meeting and gave a very informative report on the Corona virus, a topic of much concern at the present time.

Sharon stressed that viral infections have common symptoms and that specific diagnosis could only be achieved by microscopic examination of the gut lining of the infected dog as it was sloughed off in the dog's vomit. Moreover, one does not really treat the virus itself, there are no cures. What one does do is relieve the dog of the side effects and try to keep up his strength and resistance while the virus runs its course.

Symptoms include extreme vomiting of rapid onset and acute, projectile diarrhea. The virus eats away the lining of the digestive tract. Death occurs due to dehydration. The means of infection are not known, although areas of large dog concentration like kennels and dog shows increase chance of infection. As far as the specific Corona virus, Sharon said that to that date only one case had been verified in California, it occurred in a pet shop in Walnut Creek. There have however been outbreaks of undiagnosed (specifically) viral infections, most notably at the School for Guide Dogs in San Rafael.

Puppies (a year or less for INs) seem most stricken by the virus as their resistance and physical reserves are less. Adult dogs have been successfully treated by the administration of fluids intravenously. (See the Russells' story for more input on this.)

The important thing to remember is that to be successful treatment must be IMMEDIATE. At the first sign of severe vomiting or diarrhea TAKE YOUR DOG TO THE VET. Don't wait to see if it goes away on its own.

NOTES ON TREATMENT

Many, many thanks to Helen and Harry Russell for sharing the following experience with us. The treatment of Irish Wolfhounds seems too often to be of a rather experimental nature to some veterinarians. Most vets we've dealt with have appreciated all the input we could give them from our direct contact with the breed. The suggestions made by the Russells' vet, along with their dedicated care of her through the illness probably saved Arwen's life. Perhaps this account will help you save your dog someday. These are the experiences we need to share among ourselves for the betterment of all our dogs!!

The details -

The Russells' IW bitch, Arwen (Aoife of Eagle), was treated by their vet for a diagnosed case of whipworm. Subsequent to the treatment, perhaps during her visit to the vet, she contracted a "virus."

Symptoms- Loss of appetite, diarrhea, refusal of any intake of fluids. The Russells' tried dosing her with Kaopectate as a temporary measure, but she still refused to eat or drink.

Next stop-the vet's office. He said to try feeding her applesauce and rice, and prescribed medicine for settling her stomach. By the next day, Arwen had a temperature of 106°, was terribly dehydrated, and almost too weak to stand.

Again to the vet's, this time a different one- this vet felt that the most important thing for Arwen at this point was to get fluids back into her body and build up her strength to withstand the virus. He told the Russells that an IV, in his opinion, simply could not get fluid quickly enough into a dog as large as a Wolfhound. So he gave the Russells an electrolyte solution,

with instructions to administer 60 cc of the solution every 15 minutes, orally (with a large syringe, slowly). Also they were to give Arwen a mixture of baby beef and apple-sauce-60 cc every 15 minutes in the same fashion as the electrolyte solution. It was agreed that the best place to treat Arwen was at home, and the Russells faithfully followed his instructions to the letter. By the next morning, Arwen was up and wagging her tail and recovered slowly but surely from there on. The Russells' other two IWs came down with the same virus in rapid succession, but as they were now eagle-eyed for the first sign of any symptoms, the Russells caught both dogs early and began the same treatment they had used on Arwen. One dog was fine after four hours, the other after half a day. No medicine was administered in any of the three cases.

Helen feels that the oral administration of the electrolytes and the food mixture on a frequent basis, as opposed to an IV, and the ability to maintain this treatment at home rather than in the hospital were crucial factors in saving their dog's life. Harry says that Helen's dedication to caring for Arwen and maintaining the rigorous treatment schedule gave her the extra edge for survival.

Please share this experience with your vet. Get his opinions. The best dog owner-veterinarian relationship is one in which both parties can work closely with each other. And the one who stands to gain most from such a working team is your dog!

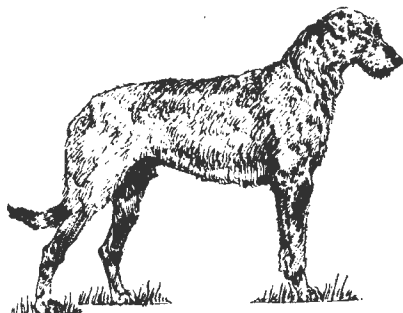

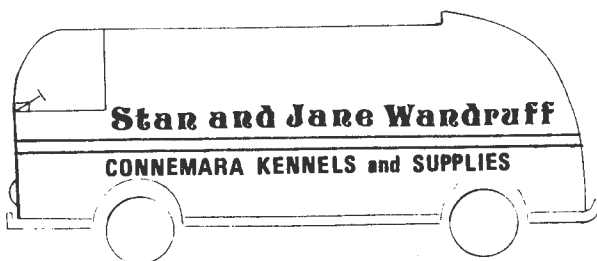
