


We will once again bench together as a Club at the Golden Gate Show. Be sure to note same on your entry. Look for more details in this issue of the Bugle.

BOARD MEETING

November 8, 1981

The meeting was called to order by the President, Ken Gabriel, at the home of Marty Mulac and Melody Waters following the Wolfhound judging at the Menzona Kennel Club Show. Board members present included: Greg Shaw, Carol Gabriel, John Hays, Russ Greene, Suzanne McCombs, and Ken Taylor. There were several other Club members present. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the Bugle.

Treasurer's Report: John Hays reported that we have \$2,000.00 in our checking account and all bills are paid.

Committee Reports: Greg Shaw reported that the Show plans are moving along. Since there was much to be discussed, it was decided to go on with the regular meeting.

Membership Applications: Carol has received applications from Kathryn and Harold Hickey, and from Jane Kit Christie and Donald Rasmusson. John Hays made a motion, seconded by Harold Major, that we accept them into the club. They were unanimously voted into the Club. WELCOME, Kathryn, Harold, Jane and Donald!

Unfinished Business: Discussion was held regarding our Wolfhound Specialty Fun Match. Betty Moore suggested that we coincide our match with IAWWC Obedience Trial. All agreed. Yvonne Heskett will be our Match secretary, and work with Betty. January dates were discussed and flyers will be sent out as soon as possible. Regarding our Christmas Party/Auction, members were reminded that they should bring a salad, casserole, dessert, or side dish for the potluck. Linda Souza will contribute a ham. Members should also bring a donation for the auction. It was felt that now was the time to select

a Show Chairman for 1983. Linda Souza volunteered and was unanimously accepted.

New Business: A nominating Committee was selected, consisting of Greg Shaw, Linda Souza, Russ Greene (Chairman), Carol Gabriel, and Agnes Tara. A letter was read from the Irish Wolfhound Club of America asking if we would consider sponsoring a Champion for the upcoming record. These would be Champions whose owners are deceased. Richard Heskett made a motion, seconded by Carol Gabriel, that we do so. Motion carried. It was decided that we would once again bench as a Club at the Golden Gate Show. All those who are planning to enter Golden Gate are urged to use green astroturf for the bench and green material to match the astroturf color for the backdrop. Individual pictures, etc., can then be added. We will also have a large club banner. All these materials could be used year after year. It is important that those entering put a note on their entry that they want to bench with the Northern California Irish Wolfhound Club.

John Hays suggested that meetings needn't be held 6 times a year at the Humane Society due to distance. He wondered if we could have program meetings 3 times a year and still have 6 board meetings, but they could be held after certain shows since we usually get together after judging. Much discussion was held and it was decided to go along with John's idea.

Discussion was then held regarding our upcoming Specialty Show. Greg reviewed his budget. Another slate of judges was chosen and Greg will contact them. There will be another Show Committee meeting during the Christmas Party.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned. Marty and Melody then hosted a fabulous get-together for us all !!!

Poinsettia - ALL parts are poisonous- DO NOT induce vomiting. Give milk or water to wash the esophagus. Get dog to vet quickly.

In all cases, when poisoning is suspected, see your vet as soon as possible.


